 hundred and eighty eight before the Right Worshipful Peter
 Calvert Doctor of Laws Master, Deputer or Commissary of
 the prerogative Court of Canterbury lawfully constituted by the
 Oaths of Abrarollus Brodie and Jan Willem Carb Esquires
 the Executors named in the said Will limited to his stock
 and other Interests in the publick funds of the Kingdom
 of Great Brittain to whom administration was granted for the
 purposes aforesaid but no further or otherwise
 having been first sworn by Common
 duty to Administor. & c.

 Newington in the County of Devon Gentleman being weak in
 body but of a sound and disposing mind Memory and
 understanding do for avoiding Controversy after my decease
 make publick and declared this my last will and
 Testament in manner following that is to say first and
 principally I recommend my soul to Almighty God who
 have it me hoping through the mediation of our blessed
 saviour Jesus Christ to obtain remission of all my sins
 my body I desire may be buried in a decent and frugal
 manner at the discretion of my Executors hereinafter
 named and as to such worldly Estate with which I hath

pleased God to bless me & live and dispose thereof as followeth
that is to say I give and bequeath unto my beloved
wife Johannah Vincent all that Armesbury Tenement or
dwelling house and premises with all and singular the
appurtenances therunto belonging situate in Causton street in
the said County of Dorset to her the said Johannah
Vincent her Executors Administrators and assigns from and
immediately after my decease for and during all the best
residue and remainder of the Term and Estate which I
shall be therein throug to come and unexpired then I
give and bequeath unto my said wife Johannah Vincent
one Annuity or yearly Rent Charge of five pounds of
lawful money of Great Britain for and during the term
of her natural life if the term which I have in a
habitation situate at Corpoint in the parish of Antony
in the East otherwise Antony Saint Sares in the County
of Cornwall shall so long continue payable quarterly that
is to say on the twenty fifth Day of March the twenty
fourth Day of June the twenty ninth Day of September
and the twenty fifth Day of December by even and
equal portions free from all Deductions whatsoever the first
payment thereof to begin and be made on such of the said
Days of payment as shall first happen next after my
decease by my Executors hereinafter named out of the Rents
and profits of my said habitation if the same shall be
received by my Executors but if my said habitation
with the appurtenances shall happen at any time hereafter
to be void and no Tenant therein this Annuity for the
time the said habitation shall be without a Tenant shall
cease and no part thereof shall be paid during so long
time as the same shall continue void then I give and
bequeath unto my said wife Johannah Vincent the sum
of seven pounds to be paid her by my Executors hereinafter
named as soon as possible after my decease then I give
bequeath and bequeath unto my three Sons in Law Thomas
Courtis Carpenter of his Armesbury ship Armesbury Thomas
Simpson Gunner of his Armesbury ship Aqueduct and
William Doyton of the said County of Dorset House Carpenter
and the Survivor of them and the Executors and Adminors of
such Survivor all that my seat or house in the South
side of Saint Aubyns Chapel in the said County of
Dorset to go in Trust and to and for all and every
the Child and Children of my Daughters Johannah (the wife
of the said William Doyton) Deborah the wife of the said
Thomas Simpson and Frances the wife of the said Thomas
Courtis lawfully begotten or to be begotten their heirs and
assigns for ever equally between them share and share
alike as Tenants in Common and not as joint Tenants
but to permit and suffer my said wife Johannah Vincent
and my said Daughters Johannah Doyton Deborah Simpson
and Frances Courtis to sit therein when and as often as
they shall think proper during the term of their natural

lives Item I Give and bequeath unto my Brother Anthony
 Vincent the sum of ten pounds to be paid him as soon
 as possible after my decease Item I Give and bequeath
 unto my said Wife Joannah Vincent the said Bedstead
 Bedstead and furniture wherein we generally lye together
 with six Chairs that are in the same Room where the
 said Bed now is with one square Oak Table one Round
 sufficient to furnish two Rooms between the House where
 I live in and the house in the possession of the said
 Thomas Curtis to be used by her during the term of her
 natural life all the rest residue and remainder of my
 personal estate for money and all other personal and
 customary Estate of what kind soever that I shall be
 possessed of interested in or intitled unto at the time of my
 decease I Give and bequeath unto the said Thomas
 Curtis Thomas Simpson and William Boyton and the
 survivor of them and the Executors and Administrators of
 my said Intent and Purpose hereinafter mentioned (that is
 to say in Trust to pay and divide the same unto
 and amongst the Children of my said Daughter Joannah
 Boyton Deborah Simpson and Frances Curtis Lawfully
 begotten or to be begotten in manner following (that is to say)
 and third part thereof to be equally divided between the
 Children of my said Daughter Joannah Boyton one third
 part to be equally divided between the Children of my said
 Daughter Deborah Simpson and the other third part to be
 equally divided between the Children of my said Daughter
 Frances Curtis but to permit and suffer my said Wife
 Joannah Vincent to live in the said two Rooms between
 the House where I live in and the house the said Thomas
 Curtis now lives in for and during the term of her natural
 life if she shall think proper without paying any
 Rent for the same and also to permit and suffer my said
 Daughter Joannah Boyton and her family to live in the
 House wherein I now live for and during the term of
 her natural life and also to permit and suffer my said
 Daughter Frances Curtis and Deborah Simpson to live in
 the respective Houses they now live in for and
 during the term of their natural lives if the term and
 Estate which I have therein shall so long continue without
 paying any Rent for the same and I do hereby nominate
 and appoint the said Thomas Curtis Thomas Simpson and
 William Boyton Executors in Trust of this my last Will
 and Testament hereby revoking all former and other Wills
 by me made In Witness whereof I have to this my last
 Will and Testament contained in two sheets of paper
 set my name to the first sheet and my name and seal
 to this last sheet This eighth Day of January in the
 twenty eighth year of the Reign of our Sovereign Lord George the Third by the Grace
 of God of Great Britain King and Ireland King of the faith and so forth and in the

year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred and eighty
eight Joseph Vincent Esq. signed sealed published and
delivered by the said Testator Joseph Vincent as and for
his last Will and Testament in the presence of us who
have subscribed our names as witnesses to the execution
hereof at the request and in the presence of the said
Testator, Rich^d Courtis, Geo Strode.

This Will was proved at London the twenty first day
of April in the year of our Lord one thousand seven
hundred and eighty eight before the Right Worshipful Peter
Calvert Doctor of Laws Master Keeper or Commissioner of the
Prerogative Court of Canterbury lawfully constituted by the Oaths
of Thomas Courtis Thomas Simpson and William Doyton
the Executors named in the said will to whom Administration
was granted of all and singular the Goods Chattels and Credits
of the deceased having been first sworn by Commission
duly to Administer.

On this the 25th Day of September 1761 before Bastiaan
Jan Ponce Notary public admitted by the Court of
Holland residing at Rotterdam and witnesses after named
appeared Mr. Jasper Atkinson of this City Merchant
and Mrs. Ann Vander Esch his wife dwelling on the Wynhuysen
on the Corner of the Vischtoog within this City known
to me Notary plus the appearer being indisposed both
however being perfectly able to dispose of the Temporal
Goods to be left by them who declared by those presents
to revoke and annul all Testaments Codicils and other
Acts of last Will which may be any wise made or passed
by them appearers jointly or each of them separately
before the date of these presents as if they had never
been made or passed and now do more disposing the
first dying declared hereby to nominate and appoint the
Survivor of them both and thus mutually one another
to be his or her the first dying sole and Universal
Pleno iure artificio institutionis of all the Goods and of
whatever the first dying may any wise leave behind
at the time of his or her decease nothing excepted provided
the Survivor of them both shall be obliged to educate
and maintain the Child or Children already procreated and
further to be procreated between them the appearers and to
be left by the first dying until each Childs age of twenty
five years or sooner marriage in the mean time to give and
grant them instructions in reading and writing and also a
proper calling in life suitable to Rank and Convenience
