This is the last Will and Testament

of Thomas Knight of Papatric in the County of Cumberland I give
and bequeath my real estate to my two daughters Henrietta Mansfield and
Maria Knight that they may sell the same and divide equally between
themselves the money arising from the sale thereof Henrietta Mansfield to
take one moiety and Maria Knight taking the other moiety for their own
own absolute use and benefit respectively I give and bequeath one hundred
pounds to my old servant Mary Corbitt and I give and bequeath the
residue of my Personal Estate after payment of the legacy
to the said Mary Corbitt to the same daughters Henrietta Mansfield and
Maria Knight to be equally divided between them for their own absolute
use and benefit respectively and if I should at any time or times give or
have given any sum or sums of money to my aforesaid daughters or
to either of them my intention is that this my Will is to take effect exactly
as it would have taken effect if such sum or sums of money had not been
given And I nominate and appoint my said daughters Henrietta Mansfield
and Maria Knight my Executors and Administrators in Witness whereof I
was Knight have to this my last Will and Testament set my hand and
seal this ninth day of November in the year of our Lord one thousand
eight hundred and forty — Thomas Knight (sb) — signed sealed published
and declared by the said Thomas Knight the Testator as his last Will
and Testament in the presence of us who in this presence and at his request
and in the presence of each other have accounts subscribed our names
as witnesses — Mary Hinde — Isabella Moses — Isabella Moses.

Spinster and made oath that she is one of the subscribed witnesses of the
execution of the last Will and Testament of Thomas Knight late of Papatric
in the County of Cumberland bearing date the ninth day of November in the
year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and forty accounts annexed
and she further made oath that on the ninth day of November aforesaid
said the said Thomas Knight duly executed his said Will by signing his
name at the foot or end thereof in the presence of this deponent and of
Mary Hinde the other subscribed witness thereto both of whom were present
at the same time and this deponent and the said Mary Hinde her copiers
